Low-Income Student Support

Universitas Negeri Jakarta institution demonstrates significant contribution to poverty alleviation and community empowerment efforts, even though no joint publications have been found with institutions in low or lower-middle income countries that explicitly focus on poverty issues. These contributions are realized through pro-poor research, active collaboration with local governments on social security programs, and international publications on the economic empowerment of vulnerable communities. UNJ consistently publishes numerous scientific papers covering topics such as poverty, social inclusion, access to higher education for vulnerable groups, and community-based economic development, featured in both accredited national journals and reputable international journals. The research trend at UNJ concerning community empowerment and local economic development also indicates an increasing academic contribution in the international arena.

University anti-poverty programmes

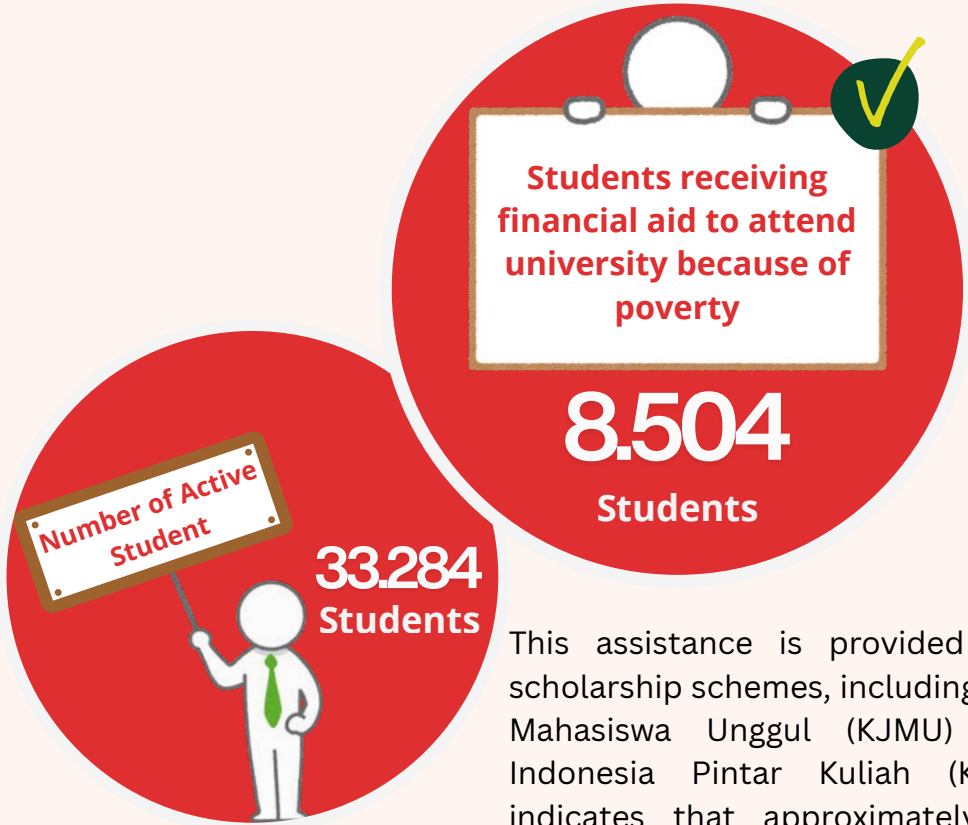
Universitas Negeri Jakarta implements social policies to ensure access to education for students from low-income families. The university has set a target that at least 20% of new students admitted each year must come from the lowest economic bracket. Additionally, UNJ also targets a 25% graduation rate for students from impoverished backgrounds by 2024. To support these achievements, UNJ provides affordable student dormitory facilities, free legal aid services, and academic mentoring programs. The university also runs various initiatives such as the Mappi Papua affirmation program, a fast-track program, and the distribution of scholarships including KJMU, KIPK, and the Developing Countries Partnership Scholarship (KNB). All these schemes are intended to ensure that students from low-income families can not only access higher education but also successfully complete their studies

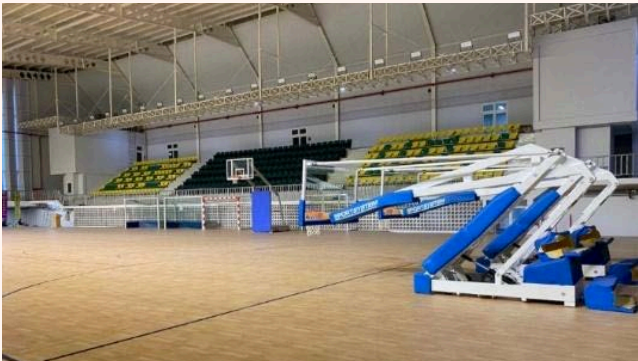
This assistance is provided through various scholarship schemes, including the Kartu Jakarta Mahasiswa Unggul (KJMU) and the Kartu Indonesia Pintar Kuliah (KIPK). This data indicates that approximately 25.5% of UNJ students receive direct financial support due to vulnerable economic backgrounds.

Community anti-poverty programmes

Universitas Negeri Jakarta is active in community empowerment programs to support local poverty alleviation efforts. Through education, training, and mentorship, the university helps foster the birth of innovation-based small and medium enterprises (SMEs), including patent facilitation and startup mentoring. UNJ has assisted areas, such as Cisaat Village, where research findings by lecturers are directly applied to encourage the formation of educational tourism villages and sustainable community businesses. The university also organizes programs to improve access to basic services (education, health, sports, clean water, electricity, sanitation, and information technology). At the policy level, UNJ plays a role locally by promoting the implementation of poverty-oriented programs and research.

As a university committed to sustainable development, Universitas Negeri Jakarta (UNJ) actively contributes to research related to food security and hunger alleviation issues. UNJ has organized a National Seminar on Food Security aimed at strengthening the university's role in supporting government programs. Furthermore, UNJ also collaborates with the local government and the community of Indramayu in livestock management, which directly impacts food security. These initiatives demonstrate UNJ's involvement in both research and collaborative practices to support the national agenda regarding SDG 2



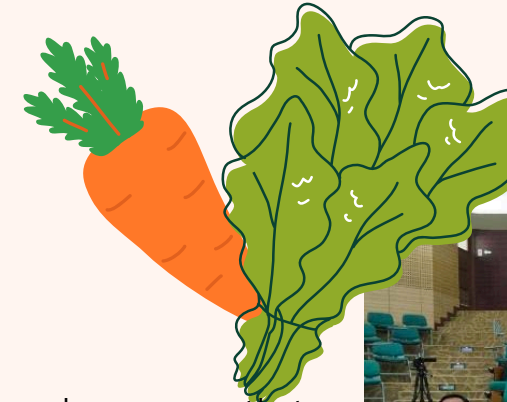
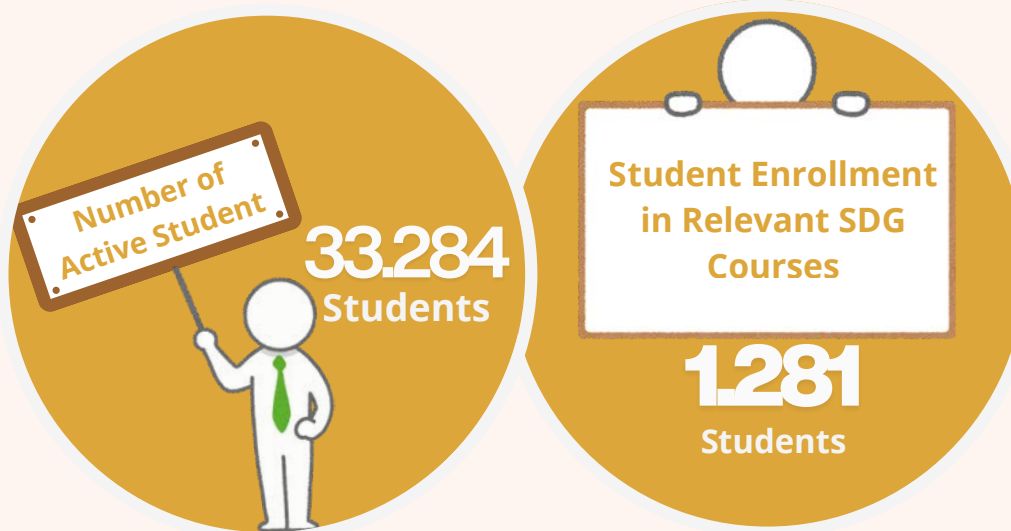

Student hunger

Currently, UNJ does not have formal programs that directly address student food insecurity, including interventions such as providing a food bank or pantry. However, the university recognizes the importance of this issue and is exploring the possibility of collaborating with external communities and organizations to design a student hunger alleviation program in the future. In terms of food options, UNJ does not yet provide sustainable vegetarian or vegan options across all campus canteens. Nevertheless, some partner canteens do offer healthy and affordable food. This effort can be seen as a preliminary step in supporting student well-being and promoting healthier consumption practices, though its scope remains limited.

As of 2024, UNJ has not yet carried out a systematic measurement of food waste generated by food services on campus, whether managed internally or through third parties. Nevertheless, the university is currently exploring strategies and partnership opportunities to begin tracking food waste data as part of its commitment to environmental sustainability and responsible consumption.

Low-Income Student Support

In line with its academic focus and institutional mandate, UNJ currently lacks formal programs that provide access to knowledge, technology, or skills related to food security and sustainable agriculture to local farmers or food producers. The university also has not organized specific events to connect farmers with food producers, nor has it provided access to campus facilities, or adopted a procurement policy for sustainably sourced local food. Nevertheless, UNJ has demonstrated involvement in food security issues through research and collaboration with local governments. This has the potential to become the foundation for developing greater university contributions in the future to support national hunger alleviation efforts.

Universitas Negeri Jakarta actively drives research focused on the critical issues of Good Health and Well-being (SDG 3), with faculty and student studies widely covering topics such as mental health, sports, nutrition, and public health. Through widely accessible scientific publications, this research significantly contributes to enhancing public and academic understanding of relevant national and global health issues. The university's commitment is further evidenced by several studies that have earned clinical citations, particularly in the fields of psychology, sports, and health education, demonstrating the direct relevance of UNJ's research in supporting health practices, psychosocial interventions, and healthy lifestyle promotion. UNJ's output includes scientific articles, seminar proceedings, and textbooks focusing on mental well-being, physical activity, and health instrument development, with interdisciplinary efforts and collaborations with national and international bodies amplifying UNJ's contribution to knowledge dissemination for the achievement of SDG 3.



Collaborations and health services

Universitas Negeri Jakarta actively collaborates with various health institutions at the local, national, and international levels. These partnerships encompass research, seminars, and community service focused on mental health, addiction, reproductive health, and health equipment innovation. This collaboration strengthens UNJ's role in supporting the health and well-being of the wider community.

Health outreach programmes

As part of the Tri Dharma of Higher Education, UNJ implements various community service programs in the health sector. These programs include mental health counseling for adolescents, drug abuse prevention, healthy lifestyle training, and sports promotion within communities. Furthermore, UNJ also provides sports facilities and serves as a training center for young athletes, thereby contributing to the improvement of physical health and the quality of life for the surrounding community.

Mental health support for students&Employee

Universitas Negeri Jakarta provides mental health services for both students and staff. For students, services include individual and group counseling, and workshops on stress management. These offerings are generally free to promote student well-being. Staff also receive support through the campus psychological service center. This includes counseling, self-development training, and psychological testing, offered both online and offline. This initiative aims to create a healthy and productive work culture across the university.

Universitas Negeri Jakarta also focuses on researching communicable diseases like typhus and foodborne pathogens, aiming to develop rapid, sensitive, and accurate detection kits. This pioneering work, developed in collaboration with institutions like the Indonesian National Police Forensic Laboratory and PT Kimia Farma Indonesia, is directly contributing to SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being by improving food safety, preventing illnesses, and ultimately enhancing the quality of life for the Indonesian population.

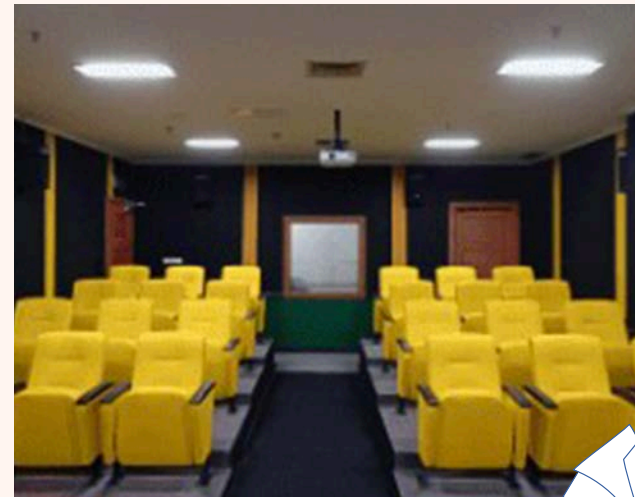

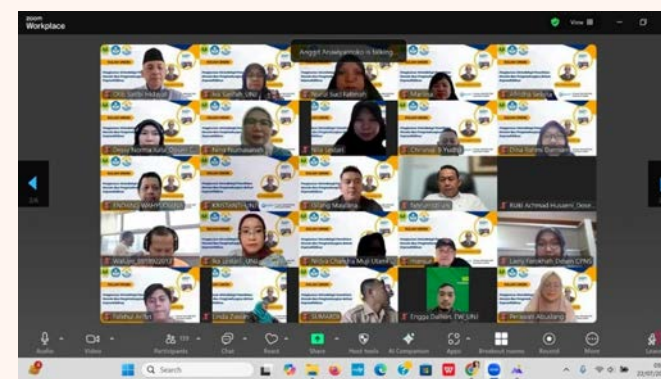
Proportion of graduates with teaching qualification

In 2024, Universitas Negeri Jakarta produced 3,955 graduates from D4 to S3 level. Of that number, 615 graduates came from teacher education programs that provide qualifications to teach at the elementary school level, bringing the proportion to 15.55%.

Student access measures

UNJ has systematically measured the application and acceptance rates of female students, although it does not yet have specific formal policies or access schemes such as mentoring or scholarships for women. The university has also not specifically encouraged female applications in fields of study where they are underrepresented.

Proportion of senior female academics

UNJ records a total of 1,142 academic staff, but the detailed number of senior female staff is not yet available, so the proportion cannot be calculated.

Proportion of women receiving degrees

Data on the number of female graduates per field of study (STEM, social sciences-humanities, arts, etc.) is still recorded at the university level, but the exact figures are not yet available.

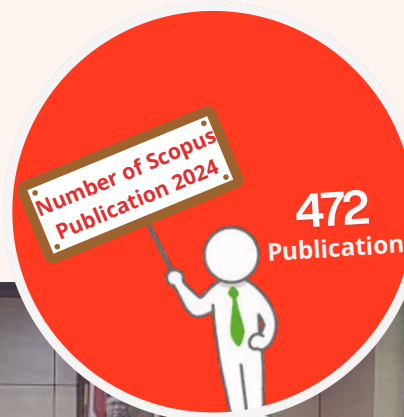

Various organizations and initiatives at Jakarta State University (UNJ), such as the UNJ Women's Forum, Girl Up UNJ, and the Sexual Violence Prevention and Handling Task Force, actively contribute to achieving Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 5 on Gender Equality. Through educational, advocacy, and mentoring programs, these organizations create a safe space for female students to discuss issues of sexual violence, raise awareness of gender equality, and encourage women's participation in leadership. This collective effort not only aligns with the global commitment to empowering women but also tangibly supports the creation of an inclusive and discrimination-free academic environment at UNJ.

Women's progress measures

UNJ has implemented important policies to support gender equality, including Rector's Regulation No. 7 of 2021 on the Prevention and Handling of Sexual Violence as a commitment to non-discrimination against women. In addition, UNJ also refers to Government Regulation No. 11 of 2017 which provides policy support for maternity leave for female lecturers and education staff. Further support is demonstrated by the existence of a childcare facility, the Cheerful Children's Development Park (Taman Tumbuh Kembang Anak Ceria) (the FIP Early Childhood Education lab), which can be used by both students and staff. However, some aspects such as specific mentoring for women, policies to protect those who report discrimination, and paternity policies to support women's participation are still not available

Achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all

Universitas Negeri Jakarta actively conducts research and technology development related to water management, such as simple filtration technology, the use of water hyacinth for treating ablution wastewater, and various studies on groundwater conservation in urban areas. These studies not only support innovation in campus water management but also make a real contribution to the development of science and the application of environmentally friendly solutions for the community.

Water usage and care

UNJ measures the volume of water used through the groundwater tank system available in several campus buildings, such as the SFD, RA Kartini, and Dewi Sartika buildings. The water is sourced from campus wells and distributed for the daily needs of the academic community. Although the volume per capita has not been calculated in detail, the water consumption recording system has become part of building management with a smart and green building concept.

Water in the community

UNJ plays an active role in community empowerment through various service programs, such as environmental sanitation management training, water safety education for people with disabilities, and the application of reverse osmosis technology to process salt water into drinking water in Pantai Sederhana Village, Muara Gembong. In addition, UNJ supports groundwater conservation in the East Jakarta area and promotes water-saving awareness both on and off campus. Cooperation is also carried out with the government, including the construction of groundwater infrastructure supported by the Saudi Fund for Development.

Water consumption per person

UNJ has implemented wastewater management based on the 3R principles (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) by using a Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) in several campus facilities. In addition, a water pollution prevention system is carried out through integrated management of solid and liquid waste, including ceramic membrane technology to prevent contamination. The university also provides free refillable drinking water facilities to reduce single-use plastic waste, and implements water-saving building standards, such as efficient flush toilets, rainwater harvesting for irrigation, and the use of drought-resistant landscape plants.

Water reuse

UNJ has an official policy contained in Rector's Decree No. 1269/UN39/TM.01.02/2020 concerning Guidelines for Healthy and Environmentally Friendly Campus Management, which emphasizes water efficiency and the 3R principles. Implementation of reuse is already underway through the reuse of ablution water with a slow sand filtration system, water hyacinth, and chlorine disinfection. However, UNJ does not yet have a formal measurement mechanism related to the volume of recycled water used on campus.

Energy use density

In 2024, UNJ's total energy consumption was recorded at 943,019 kWh, with a campus building area of 196,932 m². This data reflects the university's efforts to monitor energy consumption transparently and serves as a basis for further energy efficiency planning in various campus facilities.

University measures toward affordable and clean energy

Universitas Negeri Jakarta has implemented various policies and programs to ensure more efficient and environmentally friendly energy use. The renovation and construction of new buildings follow energy-saving standards, accompanied by plans to increase efficiency in older buildings. The campus also has an energy monitoring system through the Pustikom Command Center with the BAS IBMS application, as well as a policy of divestment from coal and oil-based energy towards cooperation with solar energy providers. In addition, carbon management is carried out by utilizing Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs).



Low carbon energy use

UNJ is fully committed to using low-carbon energy, with a total energy consumption of 943,019 kWh, all of which comes from low-carbon energy sources. This shows UNJ's strategic steps in creating a green campus and supporting the achievement of energy sustainability targets at the national and global levels.

UNJ plays an active role in raising public awareness regarding the importance of energy efficiency and clean energy. Several study programs provide direct education to the community, while the university also promotes its commitment to renewable energy through public discussions and the preparation of a master plan. In addition, UNJ collaborates with industry to provide expert services and research related to energy efficiency, and supports the government in the development of renewable energy policies. The university also plays a role in supporting start-ups engaged in low-carbon economics and environmentally friendly technology.

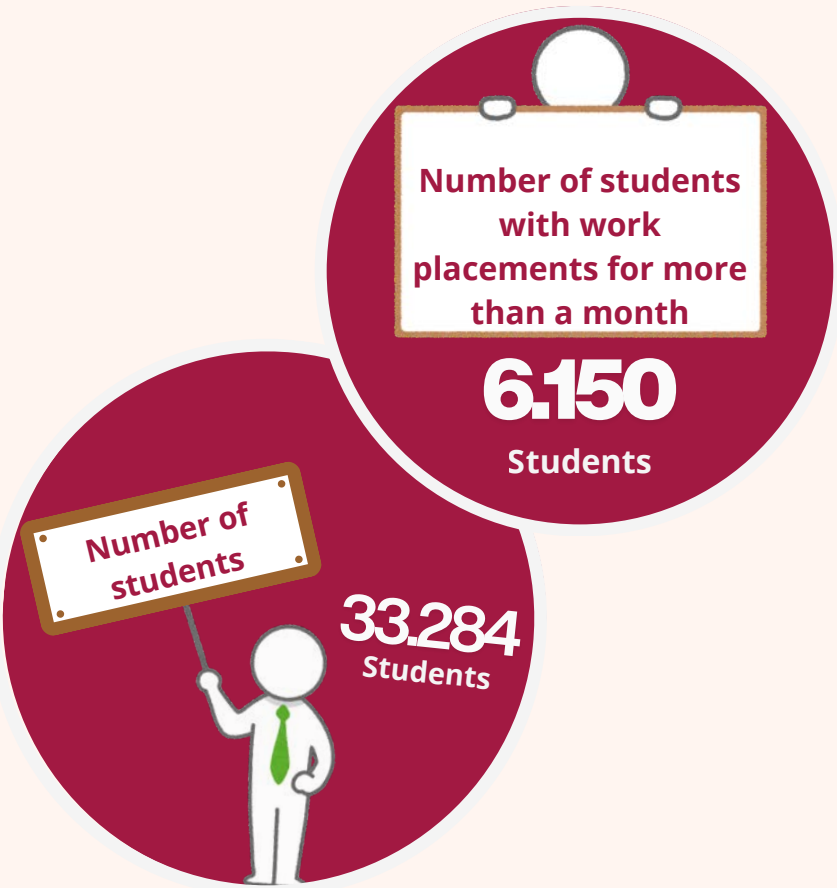

Proportion of employees on secure contracts

UNJ has 1,897 employees, including lecturers and educational staff. The majority of employees are on contracts that are sustainable for more than 24 months, which provides job security and career certainty. This reflects the university's commitment to creating stable working conditions, supporting employee welfare, and maintaining the quality of educational services within the campus environment.



Proportion of students taking work placements

The number of UNJ students was recorded at 40,378 in 2024. Some of them participate in internships lasting more than one month through the Merdeka Belajar Kampus Merdeka (MBKM) scheme, facilitated by each faculty. This program aims to provide real work experience, strengthen practical skills, and increase the competitiveness of graduates in the labor market.

Employment practice

UNJ has various employment policies that support the creation of a fair and inclusive working environment. All employees are paid according to decent wage standards, and the university recognizes the existence of labor unions for all staff, including female and international personnel. UNJ also implements anti-discrimination and anti-bullying policies, along with protection from forced labor and human trafficking practices. Additionally, there is a commitment to pay equity, the right to appeal regarding employment rights, and full recognition of the right to freedom of association and collective bargaining.

Expenditure per employee

UNJ has a total of 1,897 employees, of whom 1,133 are academic staff (lecturers). The employment and financial data show that a budget is allocated to support employee welfare, although detailed nominal expenditure per employee has not been precisely recorded. This information serves as a basis for evaluation to ensure a balance between the university's expenditure and the need to improve human resource welfare.

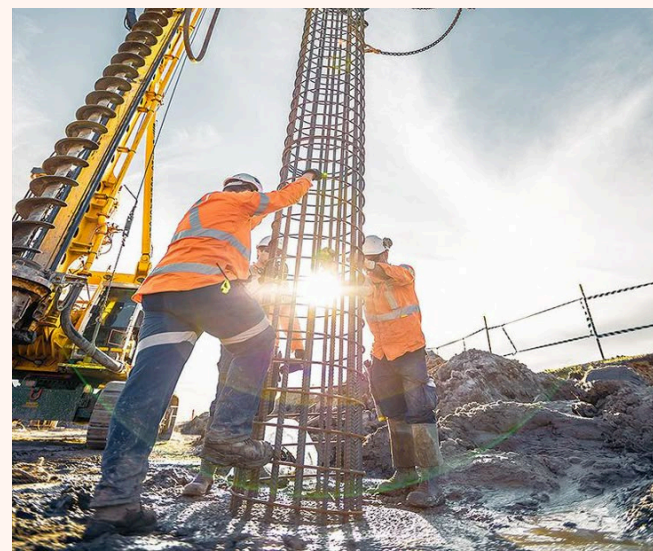

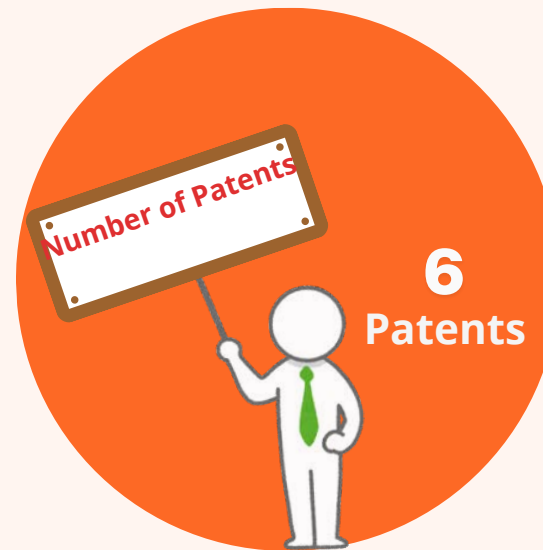

Patents citing university research

Universitas Negeri Jakarta also produced an innovation in the form of Adaptive Clothing for people with disabilities, developed by researchers from Universitas Negeri Jakarta which successfully received funding from the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy. This innovation demonstrates that Universitas Negeri Jakarta always prioritizes inclusivity and promotes equal rights for people with disabilities, including thru clothing that makes it easier for them to be active.

The Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMIPA) at UNJ received a Nanopore Sequencing Instrument grant from the Satriabudi Dharma Setia Foundation (YSDs) in July 2024 and subsequently inaugurated the Genomic Technology Installation in Room 213 of the Hasjim Asjarie Building. Thru collaboration between the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMIPA) at Universitas Negeri Jakarta and the Satriabudi Dharma Setia Foundation, research will be conducted on Kakao, including metagenomic analysis, whole-genome analysis of rice, and genomic diversity of native Indonesian ferns, which can support the national food security program.

University Spin offs

Universitas Negeri Jakarta currently does not have any spin-offs, however, after becoming a Public Service Agency (PTNBH), Universitas Negeri Jakarta is beginning to explore various opportunities to establish start-up companies that will assist in the downstreaming of research results. One step toward supporting business downstreaming at Universitas Negeri Jakarta is the official launch of bottled mineral water "eduQua" and "edura Mart," which are the result of collaboration with Indogrosir.

The Faculty of Engineering at Universitas Negeri Jakarta received a grant of 20 sets of training equipment from the Djarum Foundation to improve the quality of learning in Electronic Engineering Education. (Kabar UNJ - Februari 2024)

Universitas Negeri Jakarta secured Matching Fund Kedaireka funding for two research projects developed by Universitas Negeri Jakarta lecturers : a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Device and a Smart Anthropometry Device "Nimbang Balita" (Weighing Toddlers). Both research projects are innovative works that can promote national health resilience. These projects also collaborate with PT. Mandiri Jaya Medika, and the innovations are currently undergoing technology incubation, with the hope that the research results from Jakarta State University will have a direct impact on society.

Commitment to Inclusivity

Universitas Negeri Jakarta continues to play an active role in creating equal access to education, opportunities, and community empowerment to build a more just world. 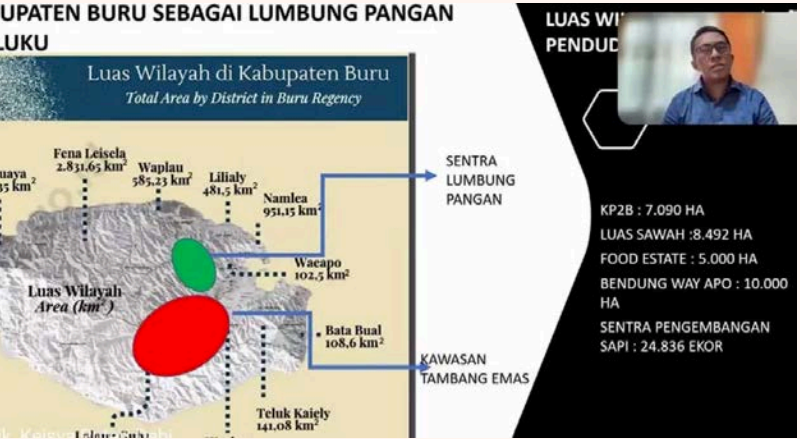

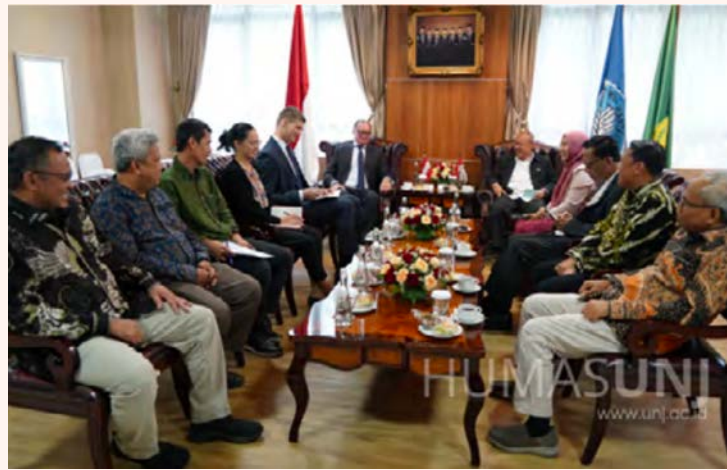
